## Our facilities


- Permanently erected test track in OO gauge and Layout in N gauge for any member to operate their models.


### **Our Members**




- Worked with Southern, Network Rail & Transport Police publicity and safety

## Our Model Layouts

- Recreate locations, scenery, vehicles and railways in model form
- Some are based on actual places from around the country and include scale models of buildings and the infrastructure located there.
- Our models based on local places include Chichester, Ford, Barnham, Littlehampton and Amberley.
- Several are totally scratch-built, others use proprietary railway items.
- The typical size of a layout is between 4 metres and 10 metres in length and approx. 1 metre in width.
- Layouts made for exhibition use have to be able to be dismantled and transported from storage to the venue and return.
- Layouts usually take 1 to 2 years to complete




