Overview

- Arun Community Transport was set up in 2018 to provide a network of volunteer drivers to support and assist the large and growing number of elderly, and often less abled, community in the Arun District. Enabling access to low cost and flexible transport for Hospital, Doctors and other medical appointment. Social travel such as hair appointments and shopping visits also feature as part of the service.
- Social Inclusion is important to isolated members of Communities and the service offered by ACT helps to improve the lives of many of its users.
- Arun Community Transport operates across 26 Parishes in the Arun District, from Ferring in the east to Selsey in the west, and north out to Arundel.



Operation

- Volunteer drivers use their own vehicles provide the transport service. Collecting their client from home and taking them to their appointment. Then waiting before returning them safely home.
- ➤ The drivers are supported by an office manager and a team of volunteer office staff in the ACT headquarters at Dove Lodge. These volunteers manage the day-to-day bookings and driver schedules.
- Volunteer Drivers can claim motoring expenses in line with HMRC rates for ACT client journeys.



The Value of Our Volunteers

- > Our transport systems today exclude many people and communities, especially older people, disabled people, rural residents and deprived households leading to social isolation.
- ➤ Well managed Community Transport Schemes, using volunteer drivers, provide a solution and a vital service in our local communities. Collecting clients from home, taking them to their appointment, and waiting before returning them safely home.
- Our Volunteer Drivers provide companionship to our clients, a 'Journey Buddy', on their trips contributing to the Health and Wellbeing of our passengers.



The Impact of our Volunteers

- > ACT have over 1,000 registered clients who rely on the provided by our volunteers.
- ACT currently have 32 volunteer drivers
- ACT currently have 10 volunteer office staff
- > ACT book and manage over 150 trips each week.
- Our volunteers spent over 180 hours per week interacting with clients, booking trips over the telephone and accompanying them to their appointments. This represents a major social contribution for those who are isolated members of our communities.

Our Aims

- ➤ To collaborate with our partner providers to develop new services, such as shopping and social trips, avoiding social isolation.
- ➤ To recruit more volunteer drivers and office volunteers to enable the operation to offer additional services within the local communities.



Our Needs

- Funding is essential to the sustainability of the Community Transport Scheme to meet our core costs. These include Office facilities, computer booking system and staff costs.
- Funding is also needed to drive new initiatives like the WAV project.
- To establish strong ties with Town and Parish councils to identify opportunities for funding grants to support the needs of residents in the local parishes.
- To identify private funders who can provide grants to support projects and initiatives for future growth of the Community Transport scheme.
